Every community in Newfoundland and Labrador has places that are valued for their heritage significance. Some of these places are formally recognized at the municipal, provincial or national level for their association with the history of the province, while others are respected locally as landmarks in their communities. These places teach us about the people and events which make up our history. The **Heritage Poster Contest** organized by the Heritage Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador is an opportunity for youth to learn more about these historic places through research, writing and artistic expression.

Here's how youth can get involved

Step 1: Artists create a poster depicting a historic place in Newfoundland and Labrador and prepare a written statement explaining why they feel the place is important to them.

Step 2: Poster must be received at the HFNL by the 21st of December.

Step 3: Posters submitted will be judged by a selection committee who will consider the poster **AND** the statement. The provincial winner will be invited to St. John's, accompanied by a parent, relative or guardian, to attend an award ceremony to be held on Heritage Day, the third Monday of February. Winners will also receive a prize and a framed certificate.
